

AQUATIC PLANT IDENTIFICATION WORKSHOP

Mount Vernon Community Center, June 27, 9 a.m. - Noon

This free indoor workshop will help people learn how to identify aquatic plants. The workshop is intended for anyone interested in lakes and ponds – boaters, people who live on lakes, or anyone else who would like to learn more about native and invasive plants.

People will learn how to use Lake Stewards of Maine's "Field Guide to Aquatic Invasive Plants" to determine whether a plant is native or invasive. We also will distribute information on which invasive plants are infesting Maine lakes. The workshop is essential training for anyone who wants to become an invasive plant patrol (IPP) volunteer, and the class is required for those seeking Tier 2 certification through Lake Stewards.
